Poster Guidelines

If you are presenting a poster at *Sea Lice 2008* please read the following information.

We recommend that all posters are A1 size (approximate dimensions: 60cm x 85 cm) with the page layout in portrait format. An example poster in this format can be downloaded from the web site:

A display board will be allocated and drawing pins will be provided for hanging posters. There is no need to bring a hard-back poster; an ordinary roll-up one will be easier to hang.

Where & When

The main poster session will take place in the conference 'break out' area on the Monday afternoon, but exhibits will be available at all coffee sessions from that point onward. We would like all posters to be ready by the end of lunch on Monday, so make sure you have hung your poster by that time.

Some General Tips

The ideal poster is designed to attract attention, provide a brief overview of the work, and initiate discussion. Posters that convey information in a visually attractive manner are likely to make use of figures, charts and tables. Text is used to summarise/highlight important messages and themes of the poster. Colour can be used to highlight and to make the poster more attractive.

Poster titles should appear at the top of the poster. If possible use a "sans serif" font like Arial or Helvetica for all text. The authors' names and affiliations should also appear on the poster.

Posters are about the discussion that happens around them, so it is important that a representative be there throughout the session to talk with enquirers.

Consider bringing supplementary literature to handout to interested participants; perhaps a few copies of relevant papers you have written, information flyers, business cards, etc.
